TOURNAMENT SITE – Heidelberg Park and Foss HS

Heidelberg Park is located at 4400 So. 19th (behind Cheney Stadium). From Highway 16 take the South 19th Street exit and head east. Turn right on Clay Huntington Blvd. across from Fred Meyer. Foss HS is located on the hill next to Heidelberg Park. There are stairs located past the main entrance to the school. You will go up those stairs to enter the field. The buses can park in the rear of the lot for both Heidelberg and Foss HS (towards Cheney Stadium). The lot will be very crowded due to Metro Parks games. If there is a Tacoma Rainiers game played that evening, inform the parking lot attendant that you are attending the district baseball tournament at Heidelberg or Foss and they will direct you to a specific area in the parking lot.

PLEASE HAVE YOUR PLAYERS BRING TWO SETS OF CLEATS (METAL SPIKES AND MOLDED RUBBER). FOSS HS DOES NOT ALLOW METAL CLEATS ON ITS PLAYING SURFACE OR SUNFLOWER SEEDS. THANK YOU FOR YOUR COOPERATION IN ADVANCE.

Metro Parks does **not** allow animals in any of its athletic complexes (Heidelberg, SERA, and Peck) except for service animals. Your cooperation and understanding of this regulation is appreciated.

- Ticket price is good for admission on **specific day of game only**. **No refunds once the game has started (this includes games called due to weather). PLEASE MAKE SURE THAT YOUR FANS UNDERSTAND THIS! This will be the 1st time many of them will pay an admission charge to a baseball game this season.**
- **Checks are not accepted. Cash only.**
- **No electronic photo of ASB cards accepted.**
- Please inform your students and parents ahead of time so they come prepared to pay an admission charge.
- Only players in uniform, entering with team prior to their game, will be admitted free entrance. Players will be expected to pay if not in uniform and/or not participating in game.
- **PRESS PASSES** will be accepted with proper identification.
- **LEAGUE PASSES - WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED**
- **SONG & CHEERLEADER PASSES** - Cheerleaders and song leaders of participating schools will be admitted free, only if **IN UNIFORM**.

GAME BALLS

- Game balls provided by tournament manager. Spaulding state adopted balls will be used. **Please help in retrieving all foul balls on your side of the dugout.**

POSTPONED GAMES

- If Saturday, May 5th games are cancelled due to weather, games will be rescheduled for Sunday, May 6th or Monday, May 7th. If May 12th games are cancelled due to weather, games will be rescheduled for Sunday, May 13th or Monday, May 14th at the same sites.
- If Wednesday, May 9th games are cancelled due to weather, games will be rescheduled for Thursday, May 10th at the same sites.
- Games Manager to determine the start times of games.

WARM UP TIMES

- Please make sure grounds crew has completed their work before entering onto the infield.
- The **HOME** team will take infield first, followed by the **VISITORS**.
- Each team has a 10-minute maximum allowance.
- The **HOME** team shall begin warm-ups 25 minutes prior to start time.
- The tournament manager will make the final decision regarding warm up times if behind schedule.

TEAM INTRODUCTIONS

- The public address announcer will introduce the visitors first, followed by the home team.
- Coaches will be introduced first, followed by non-starters and then starters.
- Please have players run out and lineup from home plate continuing down the respective baseline.
- Stay lined up until the PA has introduced both teams.
- The Pledge of Allegiance will be recited prior to **each** game while the teams are lined up on the field.

MEDICAL NEEDS

- Each team is responsible for its own medical and trainer needs.

10 RUN RULE

- The 10 run rule **will** be in effect for the West Central District.

SPEED UP RULES

- Courtesy runners, Re-Entry and Designated Hitters will be used in accordance with the Speed-Up Rules as designed by the NFHS Baseball Rule Book. These rule provisions are in effect for all league, district and state tournament games.

LENGTH OF GAME

- A regulation game shall be seven innings in length unless extended because of a tie score or unless shortened because the home team needs none of its half of the seventh inning or only a fraction of it, or because of weather or similar conditions.

SUSPENDED CONTEST

- In tournament play, any contest called by the umpire before it can be considered a regulation game (five complete innings) according to NFHS rules shall be a suspended contest and will be continued at a later time. The contest shall continue from the point of suspension. The lineup, innings pitched, batting order of each team, and pitch count will remain exactly the same as when the contest was suspended. The tournament manager will determine when the game will be completed.

PROTESTS

- Baseball rules are designed to permit coaches to confer with umpires during the progress of the contest pertaining to matters of rules administration, and umpires are instructed to permit such conference when respectfully requested and conducted in a rational, reasonable and sportsmanlike manner.
- The basis of any protest must involve a **misapplication or misinterpretation of a rule or a game condition** that may have an undue or unfair effect upon the outcome of the game. The facts and reasons for the protest must be filed with the game official, management or opposing coach **AT THE TIME THE INCIDENT IN QUESTION HAS OCCURRED** (before the next pitched ball or before the umpires leave the field if the play in question was the last play of the game). It is advisable that the game officials and both head coaches sign the scorebook and note the reason for the protest.
- Protests of an official's judgment will **NOT** be heard.
- Protests regarding playing conditions, facilities, and or equipment must be filed **PRIOR** to the start of the contest. Game officials and the opposing coach must be notified at the time.
- The tournament director will determine the members of the protest committee. The protest committee will consult with the umpires and coaches and make decisions as to the best way to proceed with the contest.
- A protest may be filed at a later date if the protest involves the eligibility of a participant.

OTHER TOURNAMENT PROCEDURES

- The current WIAA Handbook and the NFHS Baseball Rulebook will be used. Any matter not covered in either book will be left to the discretion of the tournament manager.
