TEAM INFORMATION

Roster and Eligibility

We will use rosters off the WPA site for team check in. Your WCD/SK “District” soccer roster should be completed and posted on your WPA volleyball roster page no later than Thursday, November 3rd by 4:00. We will pull rosters off your site. Please note, a team photo is part of the “District” roster page.

Team Entry

All players/coaches and managers must enter together through the gate at the entrance.

Team Limits

As per the Bound for State Guidelines, each team may have a roster of 22 players and 6 coaches/managers. 1 supervisor, 1 medical. These numbers are the same as the state tournament. No exceptions. Only those listed on the official roster will be allowed on the playing field or team bench.

PASSES AND GROUP ACCESS

Accepted Passes

WSSAAA, WSCA and WCD or SeaKing Executive Board, District 2 & 3 Lifetime, WCD Eligibility, WOA member or observer card passes are the only type that will be accepted. *No other league or seasonal passes will be accepted.*

Gate Pass List Form

Administrators or Faculty must be on the WIAA supervision gate pass list. Faculty supervisors whose names are on the gate list are expected to sit in the section representing their school. Your assistance is valuable and important in maintaining a positive sportsmanship like atmosphere at the tournament. Spectators wishing to leave and return for a later match will be stamped.

Your supervision pass list (fillable form) must be emailed to Pam Spitzer Olson, Site Director, no later than noon on Friday, November 4th.

MATCH PROCESSES

Officials and scorers:

The tournament Director will arrange for officials from the local officiating boards representing the teams within district 2 and 3. These officials will serve as game officials. Assigning secretaries from each board represented determine official assignments.

Game Balls

Game balls will be provided by the home team on the bracket.

Uniforms

The home team will wear dark-colored jerseys. The visiting team will wear light-colored jerseys. The home team is the team on the bottom of the WCD bracket.

Shoes

Most players prefer to wear the same cleats they would use on a natural grass field.

Pregame schedule and Team Introductions

Pre-game warm up will be a minimum of 20 minutes. Teams playing in the first game on Saturday will be allowed on the field 30 minutes prior to game time. During the warmup period

referees will inspect equipment and meet with team captains. With one minute remaining in the warmup period teams should line up in front of their respective benches.

The starting lineup for the visiting team will be introduced first. Each player should proceed to mid field and form a single line facing the main grandstand. They should remain in line while the home team is being introduced. When introduced, the home team will line up to the east of mid field. For the first game only, after the introductions, both teams should remain in line and turn to face the flag at the end of the stadium for reciting of the Pledge of Allegiance. Upon completion teams should return to their respective benches.

Designation of Home Team

The home team will be the bottom team of each bracket.

Games Committee/protests

WIAA District soccer Games Committee: Each Event Manager shall appoint and name a Games Committee for all postseason contests. Duties of the Games Committee shall be as follows:

1. Assist the tournament director as needed and be immediately available to him/her at all times during the event.
2. Act as an arbitration board of dispute on questions or protests that might arise. The final decision will be the consensus of the Games Committee.
3. Questions concerning infractions may be brought to the Games Committee by a coach or person in charge of a team, not by a contestant.
4. The Games Committee shall be composed of no fewer than three, nor more than five, members.
5. The Games Committee members may not be involved with the game under dispute and should be composed of 1) event manager, 2) coach, athletic director, or school administrator, and 3) head official.

FACILITY INFORMATION AND SPECTATOR SEATING

Parking vans and team buses

Drop off students near the main stadium entrance. All buses must be parked in the student parking lot on 112th street.

Team Benches

Both team benches will be located on the east side of the field. The home team bench will be located left (South) of midfield and the visiting team bench will be located to the right (North). Home team will be the team on the bottom of the bracket.

Only participants (coaches, players, managers, trainers) will be allowed on the field. Each school will be allowed two field passes for student reporters or photographers.

Training Room

There will be no on-site trainer at Franklin Pierce. Training room facility with ice will be available. Please bring your own taping supplies, the site will not supply.

Locker Rooms

Locker rooms will not be available.

Spectator Seating

Soccer spectator seating will be on the west side of the stadium. The area behind the benches (eastside) is restricted to team personnel on the roster list as well as officials and event workers only. Spectators are not allowed on the playing surface as any time.

Cheerleaders

Admitted only in uniform through the pass gate and must remain in the designated area. No more than 8 cheerleaders will be admitted in uniform, and they will need to cheer from the spectator stands.

Filming/video taping

There are a limited number of electrical outlets available around the stadium. Please bring plenty of battery power. No extension cords will be run across walkways.

General Statements

- Bands will not be permitted at the tournament.
- The official school banner will be the only sign permitted
- Any artificial noisemakers are prohibited and may be confiscated by tournament supervisors
- The throwing of confetti or other materials is not allowed.
- All WCD/WIAA regulations for spectators will be enforced.

Concessions

Limited concessions will be available.

SPECTATOR EXPECTATIONS

STUDENT CONDUCT

As games are school functions, ALL SPECTATORS are expected to exercise good judgement in their conduct and dress. UNACCEPTABLE CONDUCT IS CAUSE FOR EJECTION FROM THE PREMISES. Artificial noisemakers, such as air horns, bells, whistles, etc. are prohibited, as is the throwing of confetti, and/or other objects. Megaphones are to be used by the cheer staff only.

It is important that building administrators provide game supervision and promote a safe enjoyable event for everyone. Please remind students to wear shirts, to observe the school policy of no body or face paint, no masks, and to observe good sportsmanship. If an issue with one of your students arises, we will ask you to address it.

DUTIES OF SCHOOL SUPERVISORS

- Report to the event manager at least 30 minutes prior to their team's match. Must wear supervisor/school identification so that it is visible and easily seen.
- Sit with your school's student body and fans while your team is competing.
- Be active and visible in the cheering section with your student body and fans during all contests in order to discourage problems.
- Be willing to approach students and/or community members who display inappropriate behavior.
- Notify tournament staff of potential problem individuals.
- Be of assistance as requested by facility security staff or tournament management staff.
- Be sure aisles and stairways are kept clear in the stands. Keep your students and fans from entering the court surface.
- Assist in the orderly flow of traffic of fans entering and exiting the facility.
- At the conclusion of your match, assist your school's students and fans in leaving the bleachers. Foster the traits of good sportsmanship.
