STADIUM RE-ENTRY

Students leaving the stadium will not be allowed to return. Adults will be stamped for in/out.

SUPERVISION PASSES

Pass list must be emailed in by noon the day before your team is to play. Participating schools may list **4 supervision** personnel on a pass list who are expected to help supervise their school's students. Schools may also submit the names of school board members and superintendent.

Each school must provide a supervisor for their game.

Band Director and band members **IN UNIFORM** will be admitted free.

NOTE: WSCA & WSSAAA PASSES ACCEPTED

LEAGUE PASSES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

FACULTY PASSES, EMPLOYEE PASSES, SENIOR PASSES, AND/OR SEASON PASSES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

PRESS / TV / RADIO PASSES

May be obtained by contacting the Game Manager.

HALF TIME ENTERTAINMENT

Halftime is 10 minutes. Each school shall be allowed 4 minutes for performance by band and /or cheer team. The band director shall consult with the game manager regarding halftime and pre-game activities by no later than the end of the day prior to the game.

SIDELINES

Both team benches will be placed on the SAME sideline (North side of the stadium) and on the TRACK Surface. All Fans are restricted to the Home Grandstand. Benches are placed 10 yards from the midline and off the turf. A Fourth (4th) Registered Soccer Official is placed at a table between the benches to assist in Substitution and Bench Control. Home Team will warm up on the East end (hill side) of the field and occupy the EAST TEAM BENCH. (hill side) Visiting Team will warm up on the West end (scoreboard side) of the field and occupy the WEST TEAM BENCH (scoreboard side)

The number of people on the sidelines is limited to: team members in uniform, coaches, and managers, team physician and trainers. All other persons without sideline authorization from the game manager will be escorted to the grandstand.

Subs will wear a pennies while on the bench or warming up.

NO SEEDS OR FOOD OF ANY KIND ON TURE. SPORT DRINKS MUST BE KEPT ON THE TRACK, WATER ONLY IS ALLOWED ON THE PLAYING FIELD. SCHOOLS VIOLATING THIS RULE WILL BE BILLED FOR CLEANUP COSTS.

VISITING SEATING

Home school fans will sit in the South grandstand.
Visiting school fans will sit in the North grandstand.

TEAM ROSTERS

Squad Size - 22 players
Will be pulled from WPAN site
Please make sure you have uploaded a team picture and created a full page WCD roster.

SIGNS & SCHOOL BANNERS

Official school banners and handheld signs that are positive and directed at the school's team are permitted. **Halftime crash banners are not allowed.**

GAME PROGRAMS

BUS PARKING

Bus can park in the bus loop between the junior high and high school. Entrance is off Grandview Drive.

DRESSING ROOMS

If a locker room is requested the VISITING SCHOOL will dress in the boys varsity locker room in the high school gym. Locker rooms will be secured during game play. Cleats are not allowed in the building.

MEDICAL

Athletic Training services are provided by RET Physical Therapy.

SPECTATOR EXPECTATIONS

STUDENT CONDUCT

As games are school functions, ALL SPECTATORS are expected to exercise good judgment in their conduct and dress. UNACCEPTABLE CONDUCT IS CAUSE FOR EJECTION FROM THE PREMISES. Artificial noisemakers, such as air horns, bells, whistles, etc. are prohibited, as

is the throwing of confetti, and/or other objects. Megaphones are to be used by the cheer staff only.

It is important that building administrators provide game supervision in the stands and promote a safe enjoyable event for everyone. Please remind students to wear shirts, to observe the stadium policy of no body or face paint, no masks, and to observe good sportsmanship. If an issue with one of your students arises we will ask you to address it.

FAN AND SPECTATORS

The supervision of this section will be the responsibility of the school. Spectators are not allowed on the track or playing field at any time, and are required to stay behind the fenced areas at all times.

DUTIES OF SCHOOL SUPERVISORS

- Report to the event manager at least 30 minutes prior to their team's match.
- Must wear supervisor/school identification so that it is visible and easily seen. S
- it with your school's student body and fans while your team is competing.
- Be active and visible in the cheering section with your student body and fans during all contests in order to discourage problems.
- Be willing to approach students and/or community representatives who display inappropriate behavior.
- Notify tournament staff of potential problem individuals.
- Be of assistance as requested by facility security staff or tournament management staff.
- Be sure aisles and stairways are kept clear in the stands.
- Keep your students and fans from entering the playing surface and foster the traits of good sportsmanship.
- Assist in the orderly flow of traffic of fans entering and exiting the facility.
- At the conclusion of your game, assist your school's students and fans in leaving the bleachers.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES & SMOKING

NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES OR SMOKING ALLOWED ON SCHOOL PREMISES. This includes vape devices or electronic nicotine devices.

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ICE

Ice is available at the stadium.

GAME BALL

Game balls will be provided by either WCD III, or Curtis HS.

GAME JERSEYS

Home team will wear DARK colored jerseys.

Visiting team will wear LIGHT colored jerseys.

PRE-GAME WARMUP and INTRODUCTIONS

Home team will warm up at the East end of the field and use the East benches.

Visiting team will warm up at the West (Scoreboard) end of the field and use the West benches.

- Teams will be allowed on the field for Pre-game warm up starting at 45 minutes before scheduled start time.
- Pre-game warm up will be a minimum of 20 minutes.
- The following time schedule will be kept, using the stadium scoreboard clock: Teams can warm-up all the way to 00:00 on the scoreboard.
- When the warm-up time expires, teams need to clear the field and organize on their sideline in front of their team bench.
- Once teams are organized, the INTERNATIONAL WALKOUT to the far side football hash marks will take place. Each team will line up on the side of the field that they warmed up on.
- While teams are walking out, we will introduce the officials. Team introductions, as follows:
 - Visiting team will be announced first, proceeding down the roster in a numerical order.
 - Home team will be announced second, proceeding down the roster in a numerical order.
 - Players should remain on the field, turn and face the flag (scoreboard end) and we will conduct the National Anthem. After the anthem, players will return to their sideline

IN THE EVENT OF A TIE

The method of breaking ties will be as follows:

Two (2) golden goal (5) minute overtime periods. A (5) minute intermission will be held between the end of regulation and the beginning of the first overtime period. A coin toss shall be held prior to the first overtime as per Law 8. At the end of the first overtime period, teams shall change ends without a break. If still tied at the end of the second overtime, penalty kicks (kicks from the mark) will decide the outcome.

Kicks from the Mark

The head referee shall choose the goal at which all of the kicks from the penalty mark shall be taken. Each coach will select five (5) players, as well as the goalkeeper, to participate in the kicks. Only players who are on the field of play at the end of the second overtime period are eligible to take the kicks or be in goal. A coin toss shall be held and the team winning the toss will have the choice of kicking first or second. Teams will alternate kickers. There is no follow up on the kick. The defending team may change goalkeepers with an eligible player prior to each penalty kick. Following the five (5) kicks, the team scoring on the greatest number of kicks shall be declared the winner. If the score remains tied, each coach shall select five (5) different players (other than the first five kickers) until one team has scored a goal more than the other from the same number of kicking attempts. If the kicks continue through all eligible players (those that were on the field at the end of 2nd overtime) the teams can re-select their next 5 kickers from those that are eligible, regardless of the previous kicking order.

POST-GAME

Teams can do a traditional post-game handshake line. Teams will have 10 minutes post-game to exit the field/facility for proper cleaning and stadium sanitizing. At the conclusion of the game please make sure all garbage has been cleaned up, and all items taken with.

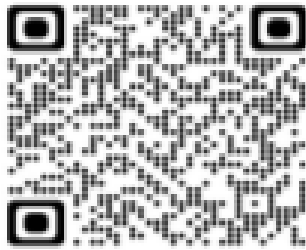
GAMES COMMITTEE

Each Tournament Director shall appoint and name a Games Committee for all postseason contests. Duties of the Games Committee shall be as follows:

- Assist the Tournament Director as needed and be immediately available to him/her during the event.
- Act as an arbitration board of dispute on questions or protests that might arise. The final decision will be the consensus of the Games Committee.
- Questions concerning infractions may be brought to the Games Committee by a coach or person in charge of a team, not by a contestant.
- The Games Committee shall be composed of no fewer than three and not more than five members.
- The Games Committee members may not be involved with the game under dispute and
- should be composed of:
 - Tournament or Site Manager
 - Coach, Athletic Director or School Administrator
 - Head Official
 - West Central District Director
 - League Commissioner
